Reading**

The Color of Water by James McBride

Due for all Grade Levels: The first day of class, the week of August 16th

One Book.

This summer, the entire Herron community, including students, faculty, staff, and administration will be reading the same book, an acclaimed non-fiction memoir titled *The Color of Water* by James McBride. Subtitled “A Black Man’s Tribute to His White Mother,” it is praised as a modern classic that “evokes a childhood trek across the great racial divide with the kind of power and grace that touches and uplifts all hearts.” We are excited for the rich conversations and class activities that will result from the shared experience of reading this remarkable text.

Students in advanced level English courses may be required to read additional texts or complete supplement assignments; this information is available on the subsequent pages of this document.

Why summer reading?

High schools with high academic expectations encourage and promote year-round learning and the reinforcement and strengthening of reading and writing skills by providing summer reading selections. As a classical, liberal arts high school that is preparing students for entrance into college, Herron High School recognizes the value in and importance of summer reading as a means of not only improving reading and writing skills, but also as a way of helping to prepare students for standardized assessments such as the SAT, ACT, ISTEP/ECA, and AP exams.

What do I do?

Students are provided a basic reading guide to assist their note-taking during reading. We encourage students to keep notes in a journal or notebook while they read; you will be able to use these notes on an assessment over the book in the fall.

How do I obtain a book?

Students have been provided a copy of *The Color of Water* in the last week of the 2010-2011 school year. Any other book required for summer reading can be obtained at the library, a book store such as Half-Priced Books, or through an online book seller such as www.amazon.com. Students may be asked to bring the books to class in the first weeks of school for discussion as activities.

Why these selections?

Herron High School's English department is dedicated to following the Art History Timeline through literature. During the four years students spend at Herron, they will explore classic texts from many cultures through the ages. Additionally, the English curriculum includes modern texts that connect to classic themes and are examples of "great" contemporary literature.

Originality and Plagiarism

All work is expected to be original and the student's own. Students who rely on information from online sources such as www.sparknotes.com or who are found to have used content from internet or other outside sources without giving credit to those sources risk failure on the assignment and additional disciplinary consequences.

*******ATTENTION MALE STUDENTS, AGE 17 AND OLDER:**
Federal law requires 18 year old men to register for the Selective Service.

Those who fail to register may be denied student grants or loans, job training, or government jobs. Males may submit information as early as age 17 and 3 months, then the registration will be processed on their 18th birthday. Register at any post office, or online at www.sss.gov.
