Dear Parents/Guardians,

Herron High School will be administering final examinations the last week of school, June 2 through June 5, 2009. The exam schedule appears below.

Final exams count significantly toward the students' final grade and could make the difference between an A or a B, or between a C or an NG and should therefore be taken quite seriously.

As a college preparatory high school, we ask that you help your student prepare for examinations. Following are ten concrete ways in which you can help your student be successful on the exams.

1. Ensure that there is a quiet place at home for studying.
2. Limit their social time outside of the house.
3. Limit their screen time, i.e. TV, movies, videos, video games.
4. Have conversations with your child about their classes and the reviews for exams.
5. Look over and talk with them about their review guides and other classroom materials.
6. Have them make flash cards and then quiz them on some of the factual materials.
7. Have them write sample essay responses to sample prompts that may appear on their exams.
8. Help them use the Exam Worksheet below as a guide to organize themselves for study.
9. Ensure they have adequate rest and a nutritious breakfast each day of exam week.
10. Get them to school *on time* for each exam.

If you have any questions about the week of exams, please do not hesitate to contact any teacher or administrator at Herron.

Students will not be required to attend classes during periods in which they do not have an exam. Students will be free to leave school when they have completed their exam period, however students must wait until the full exam time is over so as not to cause disruption to those still completing their exams.

A monitored classroom will be available for students wishing to remain at school between examinations; however there will be no 5th period during exam week. Please note the schedule times below.
